

Notice on Additional Entrance Fees for Non-U.S. Residents at 11 U.S. National Parks

According to relevant U.S. federal administrative policies and the latest official regulations implemented by the National Park Service (NPS), starting January 1, 2026, 11 U.S. National Parks will impose a unified additional entrance fee for non-U.S. residents. This policy is an administrative regulation at the national park system level and is not determined by travel agencies or tour operators. Details are outlined below.

I. Policy Overview

1. This fee adjustment is promoted by the U.S. government and implemented by the National Park Service as a unified official regulation applicable to all eligible visitors. The fee is not included in tour prices or mandatory fees and must be paid separately.

2. Eligible Visitors and Age Requirements

- Applicable to non-U.S. residents (visitors unable to present a U.S. passport, U.S. state or territorial driver's license or ID, or a U.S. Permanent Resident Card).
- Age requirement: 16 years old and above.
- Charging method: Per person, individual fee.

3. Fee Details

- Starting January 1, 2026, non-U.S. residents entering designated national parks must pay an additional non-resident surcharge on top of the standard park entrance fee.
- Non-resident surcharge: USD \$100 per person, per national park (ages 16 and above).

4. The following 11 National Parks are covered:

- Grand Canyon National Park
- Yellowstone National Park
- Yosemite National Park
- Zion National Park
- Grand Teton National Park
- Glacier National Park
- Rocky Mountain National Park
- Bryce Canyon National Park
- Acadia National Park
- Sequoia and Kings Canyon National Parks
- Everglades National Park

II. Entry and Payment Options

For itineraries involving the above national parks, non-U.S. residents may comply with entry and fee requirements through the following options:

1. Pay the non-resident surcharge on-site when entering the national park, at USD \$100 per person, per park (ages 16 and above).

2. Purchase the official Non-Resident National Parks Annual Pass offered by the U.S. National Park System.

- Price: USD \$250 per person per year, valid for one year from the purchase date.
- During the validity period, holders are exempt from paying the per-visit non-resident surcharge.
- The pass may cover the holder and up to three accompanying visitors aged 16 or above, subject to on-site enforcement by park authorities.
- The pass can be purchased through the official National Park Service platform: <https://www.recreation.gov/interagency-pass/types/nonresident>. Usage rules are subject to current NPS policies.

3. The non-resident surcharge is a policy-based fee uniformly enforced by the National Park Service. It is not collected in advance and is not included in tour prices or mandatory ticket fees.

Eligible visitors may choose their preferred payment method independently.

III. Important Notice

- National park staff may verify visitor identity during ticket purchase or park entry. Visitors are advised to fully understand this policy before booking or traveling and to carry valid identification documents at all times.
